The Swedish Cultural Center ended 2006 with two traditional Swedish events – the Lucia Pageant and the Lutfisk Dinner. The Lucia Pageant was produced jointly by the Swedish Cultural Center and the University of Washington's Swedish Club. This year's event featured performances by the Nordiska Musicians and Dancers. Also, Dråm, a folk duo from Sweden, completed their west coast tour by performing some traditional Swedish music before the pageant. The Lutfisk Dinner, offered by the Svea Male Chorus for many years, became an event sponsored by the Swedish Cultural Center in 2006. Chorus members helped with the event, which led to the dinner's success.

We begin 2007 by looking forward to many events at the Swedish Cultural Center, including the Scandinavian Flea Market and the Swedish Cultural Center Auction. January 13 is the date of the Scandinavian Flea market, which provides members and non-members the opportunity to buy and sell items of Scandinavian origin, though some non-Scandinavian items will be included at the Flea Market. The Swedish Cultural Center Auction will be held on February 10 at the Swedish Cultural Center, with proceeds going toward the Cultural Center's Scholarship program and toward building improvements.

In the December *Swedish Center News*, we tried a new format for the calendar: two months of calendars, on the back page. This month we have kept this new format, this time with larger print.

Hemlandsnytt

News from the homeland

A column of current Swedish news topics, taken from Swedish news media. They do not reflect the opinions of the Swedish Cultural Center.

Nobel: On December 10, persons gathered at the Stockholm Concert Hall to watch seven of the year's Nobel Prize winners receive their medals from the King. The Hall was decorated with 13,000 flowers from San Remo, Italy, but the interest for the flowers could not match the interest for the Royal family and the beautiful dresses worn by the princesses.

Number one: Sweden is the most democratic country in the world according to the respected British magazine, The Economist. The magazine studied 167 countries for their democratic views and then awarded points. Sweden won with 9.88 of 10 possible points, followed by Iceland, The Netherlands, Norway, Denmark and Finland.

Harms way: Sweden is planning to send additional soldiers to some of the most dangerous places in the world. The Defense Department has recruited soldiers for service in Darfur and it will also increase the Swedish forces in Afghanistan.

Salty: In pace with the Finns, who have lowered the intake of salt, the risk of heart attack and stroke have dropped radically, in Sweden. Swedes, who eat about 12-13 gram of salt per day, have been urged through media campaigns to halve their salt intake in order to save lives.

Snuff: The tax on snus (snuff) will increase dramatically after New Year's and the stores are stocking up their supply of the much desired stuff. However, there are some speculations that many users will kick the habit and throw away their snuff boxes rather than pay the high prices.

Royal visit: In the beginning of June, Hindersön, an island outside Luleå with a population of 30 people, will have a visit by the King. The citizens of the island will have Elsa Östling, 89, to thank for the nice visit. A year ago, a local organization printed a newsletter that published the history of the island. Elsa was delighted and sent a copy to the King along with an attached invitation: "If your royal Highness happens to be in the area, you are very welcome stop by and see us." The King has now accepted the invitation!

What a relief: One day in March, 1986, a truck arrived at the police station in Hagfors, Värmland, and offloaded pallets filled with paper towels, toilet paper and other household items. Somebody had mistakenly written an order that should have been for only one box of the stuff. The police chief tried in vain to stop the offloading and after four hours carrying and stowing, large areas of the station, mainly the garage, had been transformed to a storage place. After 20 years, it was finally time to open the last item - a roll of paper towels.
